Distance Learning Scholarships

The Commonwealth Scholarship Commission in the UK is awarding 20 scholarships to study (by distance learning) for the MSc in Veterinary Epidemiology and Public Health, and the MSc in Livestock Health and Production offered by the Royal Veterinary College, University of London. The scholarships are open for students from **Bangladesh** and **Sri Lanka** only. This pack includes the application form and all of the information you will need in order to apply for these scholarships.

This application form is for students applying for the scholarships **and** for a place on either of the above-named programmes. The MSc programmes, which can be completed in 2-5 years, consist of both three core and four optional courses (chosen from the lists below). The materials that you receive and the amount of internet access required for each course is as shown in the tables below:

Entry requirements

To study for the MSc students must have:

EITHER

- A second class honours degree or the equivalent in a scientific subject, veterinary science, animal science, agriculture, biological sciences or medicine;

OR

- A second class honours degree in a scientific discipline, which has, in the opinion of the University, included suitable training.

English language requirements

All applicants must have passed a test of English Proficiency acceptable to the University of London – within the past three years – for example IELTS with an overall score of 6.5, with a minimum of 6.0 in each sub-test or TOEFL score of 580 (or 237 in the computerised test) plus 4.5 in the Test of Written English (TWE)/Essay Rating.

Other documentary evidence (Please note that any documents submitted **cannot be returned**. Do not submit original degree certificates.)

In support of each application, the following documents are also scrutinised carefully:

- Supporting statements from the applicant's two referees.
- Covering letter indicating why the applicant wishes to attend the course.
- Academic transcript. Academic transcripts are confidential, please request that the University sends them directly to Ruth Chandler at the address below. **Please note that these will not be returned.**

What will you get from the Scholarship?

The scholarship will pay the full tuition fee of the MSc which amounts to £8,250.

In addition, students will receive £200 to cover the cost of internet access and in-country examination registration/travel costs.

There will also be an annual teaching workshop (1 week in duration) held in both Bangladesh and Sri Lanka for the candidate in their own country, by RVC academic staff. Travel, accommodation and board for the candidates will be paid for by the Scholarship.

Examination and Assessment

Course assessment is by Tutor Marked Assignments (TMA's), which constitute 20% of the marks and, a 3-hour unseen written examination, constituting 80% of the marks.

Students may submit up to three TMAs for each course in which they will be examined and the best assignment will contribute to the final examination mark. Tutors provide a detailed feedback report for the student as part of TMA marking and which enables students to monitor and, where necessary improve, the quality of both their understanding and presentation skills.

Examinations take place once a year in October. The examinations are normally held in the student's country of residence, at a centre arranged either through the local Ministry of Education or the British Council.

This MSc course does not involve time outside of the student's own country.
